Survivors include her children, Nancy Sacco (Danny), George Robert Kreush and Robin Stone (Ed); grandchildren, Kristi (Pat), Traci (Brian), Michael (Jill), Stephanie (Edward) and Lindsey (Chris); as well as twelve great-grandchildren. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Robert H. Kreush; sisters, Belver Robinson, Myrtle Fisher and Mae Mills; brothers, Willard, Odell and Jack Robinson.
