Harvey Jules Rosen, 89, of Columbia, peacefully passed away on March 21st 2019.

Harvey was born in Columbia, SC on April 8, 1929. He was a loving and devoted Father, Grandfather, Great Grandfather, brother and uncle. He was adored by his family and admired by his friends and business associates.

He attended Columbia High School and graduated from the University of South Carolina in 1950. His post graduate studies were at USC where he studied Real Estate Appraising.
